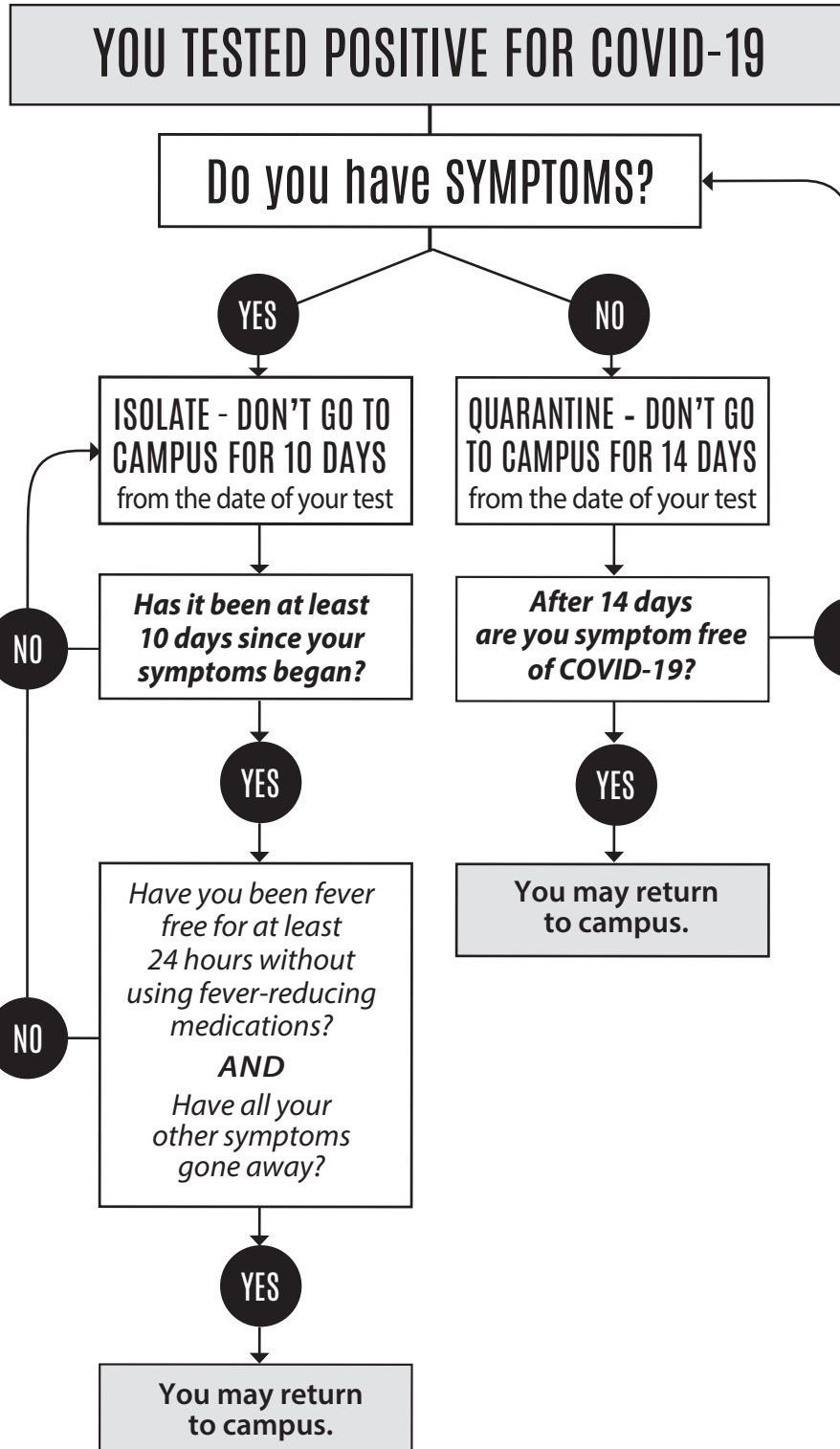




COVID-19 GUIDANCE – WHEN TO Return to Campus Checklist

Scenario #1*



COVID-19 SYMPTOMS

- Fever or chills
- Cough

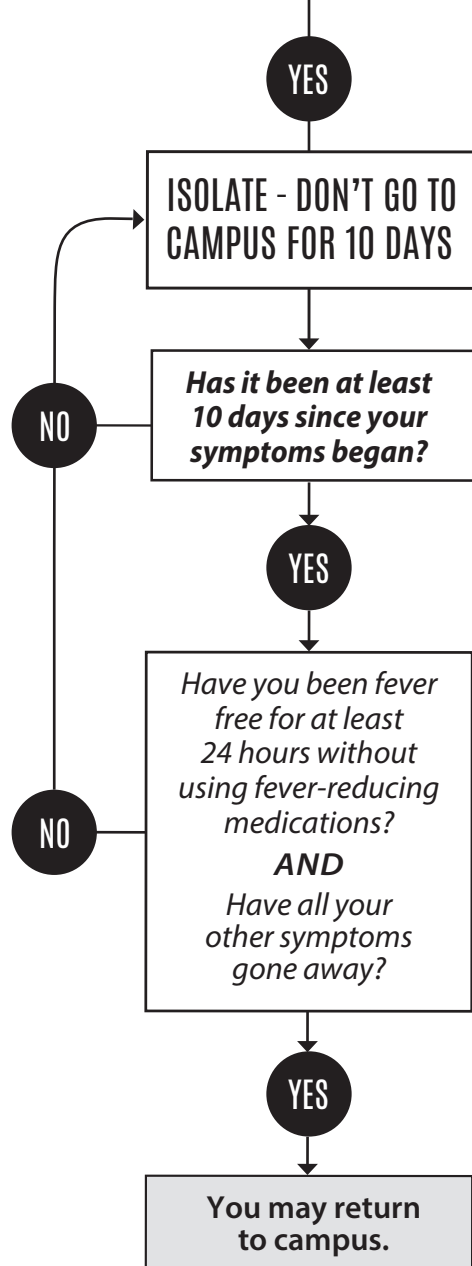

YOU LIVE WITH SOMEONE WHO TESTED POSITIVE FOR COVID-19
