

 - Use your *unofficial transcripts* to prove your coursework by highlighting the appropriate courses.

 - Fill in the information and notify your instructor that we will be contacting them.
- **Page 13-14**: Two video clips of your English and signing skills: (Total points possible: 50)
 - 2-4 minutes in length.

- **Prepare a cover letter**: (Total points possible: 9)
 - The letter should be addressed to the Interpreter Training Program Admissions Committee and should include what makes you an outstanding applicant for the Interpreter Training Program.
- **Two letters of recommendation.** See details on page 15. (Total points possible: 8)
 - One letter regarding your character.
 - One letter regarding your work ethic (either academically or at the job).

- **Submit your application**. It should appear professional and organized. See email address below.
- □ **FACULTY DISCRETION: POTENTIAL INTERVIEW:** The applicants may be invited for an interview within 60 days after application deadline.


