As a result, the parent should not include any unborn children in the family size.

Important Note: The instructions below apply to the student and each parent included in the household. Notify the financial aid office if the parents filed separate IRS income tax returns for 2023 or had a change in marital status after December 31, 2023. As part of federal student aid eligibility, the student and parents will be required to consent and approve sharing and importing income and tax information from the IRS to the FAFSA form, even if the attempt to obtain or use such data is ineffective.
