<p>After review of SCC’s 2016 Mid-Cycle Evaluation Report, NWCCU expressed confidence that the college is “positioned to provide evidence of mission fulfillment and sustainability in its Year Seven Self-Evaluation Report.” (SCC’s report was submitted in October 2016; the Commission approved the report in February 2017.)</p>	<p>SCC continues to self-assess, reflect, and prepare for its Year Seven Report. Additionally, the College completed an Ad-Hoc report for its Applied Baccalaureate in Respiratory Care. The campus visit was October 2, and SCC awaits an official response from the Commission.</p>	

<p>NWCCU accepted SCC's Spring 2017 Ad-Hoc Report which addressed Recommendation 2 of the Fall 2013 Year Seven Peer Evaluation Report. NWCCU requests that the college address Recommendation 2 of the Fall 2013 Year Seven Peer-Evaluation Report as an addendum to the College's Fall 2020 Year Seven Self-Evaluation Report.</p> <p>Recommendation 2: The evaluation committee recommends that the institution develops systematic and college-wide means to assess the student learning outcomes associated with general education and demonstrate that these data are used to inform decision making. It is further recommended that the institution develop a systematic and college-wide means to assess the student learning outcomes of programs in relation to the institution's mission and demonstrate that these data are used to inform decision-making at that level. (Standard 2.C.2, 2.C.9, 2.C.10; 4.A.1, and 4.A2)</p>	<p>The College will prepare an addendum.</p>	<p>SCC has made major changes to its program review process. The process now includes comprehensive, annual review of student learning outcomes at the program- and degree-levels. Additionally, the College has added review of student learning outcomes to the workloads of its Core Theme Teams. The work on college-wide abilities that was included in the Mid-Cycle review continues.</p>
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
