In addition to completion of the admission criteria, applicants will need to complete a total of 34 credits of the following coursework prior to admission with a (grade of B- or higher):

Introduction to Education (EDUC 201,3cr) (at SCC EDUC& 202/267)

Introduction to Special Education (SPED 363, 4cr) (at SCC EDUC 204)

Math Proficiency (at SCC MATH& 107)

English Composition II (ENGL 201, 5cr) (at SCC ENGL& 102)

Introduction to Communication (CMST 200, 4cr) (at SCC CMST& 101 with 2.8gpa or CMST 227 may be substituted with 2.8gpa)

Applicants pursing the Secondary Education Program will also be required to pass all basic skills and certification tests (WEST B/WEST E/ NEW/ACTFL) (SCC students take WEST B before transferring to EWU) (SAT may substitute, see EWU) Educational Psychology (PSYC 304, 5cr) (only at EWU)

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
